Built in 1846 and expanded in 1886, Swan Point is an excellent example of the garden cemetery movement. A final resting place for 23 RI governors and more than a dozen congressmen and senators, Swan Point Cemetery is packed with history.

Join architectural historian Ronald J. Onorato and Lippitt House Museum's Cathy Saunders on a walking tour to explore the park-like setting of the oldest section of the Cemetery, with historic monuments and notable landscaping features highlighted along the way. Learn how design connected to culture while hearing stories of Lippitt family members and their Providence contemporaries.
